Fundamentals of Farrier Science

Students will learn the professional responsibilities of the trade and the role of the modern farrier within the equine industry. They will learn and practice the essential requirements and habits of a safe work environment for both farrier and horse. Students will learn forging skills of the trade. They will develop and execute a personal fitness plan. Level: VO

Equine Anatomy and Physiology

Students will examine the anatomy of the horse with an emphasis on the appendicular skeleton. They will study the physiology of the horse and develop an understanding of how trimming and shoeing can improve or detract from proper leg and hoof function.

Equine Conformation and Trimming

Students will learn the varieties of conformation possible for the modern equine. They will learn the indicators to assess horse health. Students will learn to assess the trimming needs of a variety of horses to be kept barefoot. They will practice using tools common to the farrier trade to trim horses' hooves. Students will practice trimming horses to be maintained unshod.

Horseshoe Forging

Students will learn the skills to forge mild steel using hand tools. They will learn how to operate a gas fired forge and use a variety of tools common in the farrier industry. Students will learn the fundamentals of forging horseshoes from bar-stock. They will learn to modify manufactured shoes to meet the needs of equine clients of the farrier shop.

Horseshoeing

Students will learn to assess the trimming and shoeing needs of a variety of horses. They will trim both fore and hind hooves in preparation for the application of shoes. Students will modify or make, and fit horseshoes with and without heat. They will apply the fitted shoes and complete the shoeing process. Students will create a record of the work done to individual horses.
